

Offering community groups the opportunity to bid for capital funding of up to £10,000 and revenue funding of £2,500.

The focus of the grant scheme for this round is organisations that have not currently benefitted from any Covid19 related grants and also for those organisations who have identified needs resulting from the impacts of Covid19, or are restarting groups or activities that were affected by the Pandemic.

Applicants for the grants should think about how their initiative or project would support one or more of the following:

- Improved understanding of different people and cultures in our local community

 For example, reminiscence and oral history projects, local history exhibitions, parish surveys, projects to bring together different cultures or generations.
- Increased involvement from people who face barriers to participation in community life
