

Britain celebrated May 8th 1945, Victory in Europe as VE-Day, street parties were held. Labour won the General Election and wanted a Better Britain for all, but had to contend with the financial burdens from the war years. Rationing continued, especially in 1946 with a huge bread shortage after the harvest failed. The National Health Act was passed, free medical help, dentists, opticians became available and BBC resumed televising in 1946, first broadcasts for children, Muffin the Mule. Austerity continued for years after the war. The Government tried to provide jobs, constructing houses and prefabs with indoor toilets. Coal, iron, steel, railways and electricity were nationalised.

Meanwhile in Southery, the Wissington Railway carried produce to the main roads and Wissington Factory. The Italian Prisoners of War helped with the land work, worked on the railway and constructed 9 ft concrete roads through Feltwell Fen. They were housed in Poppylot Camp on the Feltwell Road. A church, St. Paul's, catered for the many families from the Norfolk County Council Holdings and farms on the Feltwell Road. Large areas of fen scrubland were opened up and cultivated for the first time to help with the national effort to produce food and be self-sufficient.

November 21st 1946 saw the first meeting of the Southery branch of the NFU. The meeting was held in the Oddfellows Hall and housing and the need for land workers was on the agenda. The NFU was concerned about the shortage of housing for agricultural workers, many prefabs and council houses were built after the war, particularly the houses in Recreation Drive and Hall Close. A Young Farmers Club was started in Downham Market, providing agricultural education and a marriage bureau.

Mr. Bartholomew carried on as Headmaster, ably assisted by Mrs. Bartholomew. The school leaving age was raised to 15, some of the older children from Southery went to Downham Secondary School for lessons for cookery. A new canteen block was built at the bottom of the school yard and central heating with a boiler house was installed. Electric light and mains water were installed before the war.



The Rev. W. H. Woodhouse took over from Rev. E Morton in 1947 and looked after St. Mary's Church, St. Mary's the ruin and St. Paul's Poppylot. The roof of the ruin was removed and some of the walls lowered to make it safe in 1949. The Bishop of Ely visited the little wooden church, St. Paul's of Poppylot, packed to the doors with people, who had walked along the tracks from remote farms. The spire was restored on St. Mary's and the new altar dedicated in the side chapel, dedicated to the long serving Rev. Clement Hall. The Rector provided 2 houses on a Monday night of the Parson's Picture Palace, especially Westerns. Tennis was played on the Church tennis courts. November 1949 the new District Nurse moved into the nurse's bungalow and the new War Memorial Tablet was dedicated by Flt. Lt. Finlay a member of the congregation.

Everyday life continued to be difficult. The winter of 1946 was harsh, windy and bitterly cold with heavy snowstorms, bringing hard times once more. In the spring of 1947, the snow melted, the ground was hard and the River Wissey burst its banks. The River Wissey flooded the farmland around Hilgay and Southery. Despite valiant efforts from the Army and villagers, the waters broke through a culvert under the Ferry Bank, Southery, Feltwell Fen was flooded. Some families abandoned their homes and moved into the school and some stayed in temporary quarters in Bexwell. Donations were gratefully received from the Lord Mayor's Fund, the government and the NFU Agricultural Disaster Fund to rebuild the flooded areas. The farmers worked hard to grow crops as soon as the fields could be planted, food was still desperately short. The summer was dry and hot, Les Legge grew some of his best cabbages ever.

Lynn News & Advertiser 1945 - There was a large congregation for a VE-Day thanksgiving service at Southery Parish Church, conducted by the rector, the Rev. E. Morton, while a well-attended service was also held at the Methodist church conducted by Mr. Willis Griggs. On the Sunday (May 13th) afternoon members of the Home Guard, Civil Defence and other organisations marched through the village to the parish church, which was crowded for a service conducted by the rector. The collection amounted to more than £18 for the Red Cross.





 Cut out two 10-by-6-inch rectangles of cotton fabric. Use tightly woven cotton, such as quilting fabric or cotton sheets. T-shirt fabric will work in a pinch. Stack the two rectangles; you will sew the mask as if it was a single piece of fabric.




3. Run a 6-inch length of 1/8-inch wide elastic through the wider hem on each side of the mask. These will be the ear loops. Use a large needle or a bobby pin to thread it through. Tie the ends tight.


Don't have elastic? Use hair ties or elastic head bands. If you only have string, you can make the ties longer and tie the mask behind your head.



2. Fold over the long sides ¼ inch and hem. Then fold the double layer of fabric over ½ inch along the short sides and stitch down.



4. Gently pull on the elastic so that the knots are tucked inside the hem. Gather the sides of the mask on the elastic and adjust so the mask fits your face. Then securely stitch the elastic in place to keep it from slipping.



Materials

- Bandana (or square cotton cloth approximately 20"x20")
- Rubber bands (or hair ties)
- · Scissors (if you are cutting your own cloth)




Fold bandana in half.



Fold top down. Fold bottom up.




Place rubber bands or hair ties about 6 inches apart.



Fold side to the middle and tuck.
